

Medications For Bronchitis: Bronchitis Disease Reference Guide

For chronic bronchitis or either acute bronchitis, signs and symptoms may include: you may have a nagging cough that lingers for several weeks after the inflammation resolves. If you have acute bronchitis, you might have chronic bronchitis, you may be referred to a doctor who specializes in lung disorders (pulmonologist). Bronchitis (Acute) Symptoms, Treatment, Causes

What is, and what are the factors behind acute bronchitis? Acute bronchitis is inflammation of the bronchial tubes, and a cough lasting more or 5 days indicates acute bronchitis as a cause. People who have repeated acute bronchitis may develop chronic bronchitis. The most common causes of acute bronchitis are viruses. Bacterial causes of the disorder contain: Other irritants (for instance, tobacco smoking, chemicals, etc.) may irritate the bronchi and cause acute bronchitis.

Chronic Bronchitis Symptoms, Treatment and Contagious

Bronchitis is considered chronic when a cough with mucus continues for at least three months, and at least two years in a row, for most days of the month. Bronchitis occurs when the trachea (windpipe) and the large and small bronchi (airways) within the lungs become inflamed because of disease or annoyance from other causes. Chronic bronchitis and emphysema are forms of a condition characterized by progressive lung disease termed chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD).

How is Bronchitis Treated?

You have acute bronchitis, your doctor may recommend rest, lots of fluids, and aspirin (for adults) or acetaminophen to treat fever. If you've chronic bronchitis and also happen to be diagnosed with COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease), you may need medicines to open your airways and help clear away mucus. If you have chronic bronchitis, oxygen therapy may be prescribed by your physician. One of the best ways to treat chronic and acute bronchitis would be to remove the source of irritation and damage .

Bronchitis is an inflammation of the lining of your bronchial tubes, which carry air to and from your lungs. Bronchitis may be either acute or chronic. A more serious illness, chronic bronchitis, is a persistent irritation or inflammation of the lining of the bronchial tubes, often on account of smoking. Chronic bronchitis is among the conditions contained in chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD).
